### 2.14 Significant Activities and contributions made by IQAC

The IQAC sees that plans submitted on various parameters related to Curricular Aspects; Teaching, Learning and Evaluation; Research, Consultancy and Extension; Infrastructure and Learning Resources; Student Support and Progression; Governance, Leadership and Management; and Innovations and Best Practices are complied with. The IQAC makes very valuable suggestions on the seven criteria and decides to implement those suggestions which are feasible for the Institution.

Several improvements have been made in the feedback system. The faculty evaluation forms were revised. Online feedback about faculty was obtained from BA/BCom students of semesters I/II/III/IV/V/VI. The feedback from parents was obtained on 16<sup>th</sup> December 2017 and an analysis was made of the same. Institutional feedback was obtained from all BA/BCom students for the first time. BA/BCom Semester I and II students also provided feedback on curriculum for the first time. An analysis of all feedback was done by the IQAC and action has been taken, wherever necessary.

As per the decision taken by the IQAC, the process of internal academic audit has been initiated during this academic year with the objective of improving the quality of teaching-learning-evaluation. The academic audit was conducted successfully.

New methodologies have been introduced in the teaching-learning process. Peer learning has been introduced for some courses and the same has been documented. All teachers submitted their teaching plans and compliance of teaching plans to the IQAC.

The IQAC organized a one –week State-level Faculty Development Programme on 'Professional and Self-Development for College Teachers' from 16<sup>th</sup> October 2017 to 21<sup>st</sup> October 2017. Dr.SujataSatapathy, Associate Professor, Clinical Psychology, Department of Psychiatry, AIIMS, New Delhi and Dr.MeghaDeuskar, Head, Department of Psychology, Fergusson College, Pune were the resource persons for this Faculty Development Programme. The workshop was organized with a view to build interpersonal, leadership, communication and conflict management skills in college teachers and to impart knowledge, skills and attitudes on effective mentorship.41 participants from 7 colleges across the state participated in the Programme.

The IQAC organized a national seminar titled 'Quality Enhancement and Assurance in Higher Education Institutions in the context of the Revised NAAC Assessment and Accreditation Framework' on 9<sup>th</sup> April 2018. Dr. SiddalingaSwamy, (Coordinator, Quality Assurance Cell, Department of Collegiate Education, Bengaluru) was the Chief Guest and keynote speaker. He also addressed the participants on Innovative Methodologies in the Teaching-Learning process. Prof. ManikraoSalunkhe, Honourable Vice Chancellor, BharatiVidyapeeth Deemed University, Pune was the Chief Guest for the valedictory function. The other resource persons included Dr. ShirishChindhade (NAAC Assessor and Former Principal, M.U. College, Pimpri, Pune), Prof. PranabMukhopadhyay (IQAC Coordinator, Goa University) and Prof. V.R. Shirgurkar (NAAC Assessor and Former Principal, ParvatibaiChowgule College, Margao, Goa). Theseminar was organized with a view to acquaint the participants with the Revised NAAC Assessment and Accreditation Framework. The seminarfocussed on Documentation for the Revised System of Assessment and Accreditation by NAAC, Benchmarking and Goal Setting Innovative methodologies in the teaching-learning process, and Research, Innovations and Best Practices.

### 5.8 Details of gender sensitization programmes

- The Gender Champions initiative has been launched by Goa University under the Ministry of Women and Child Development and Ministry of HRD. The Nodal Teacher for this initiative at MES College was Ms. Poorwa Naik and the Gender Champions were Ms. Priyanka Prajapati from T.Y.B.Com. and Mr. Abhishek Thakur from S.Y.B.A. The Gender Champions along with the Nodal Teacher attended a One Day State Level Training Workshop for Gender Champions and Nodal teachers organized by Department of Women's Studies, Goa University which was held at S.S. Dempo College of Commerce and Economics, Cujira-Bambolim on 13<sup>th</sup> January 2018. The Gender Champions were assigned various tasks, activities to understand the concept of 'gender-equality' and were provided with reading material to broaden their vision on gender-equality.
- On 10<sup>th</sup> February 2018, the Gender Champions along with the Nodal Teacher were invited to attend the 'Difficult Dialogues 2018' on "Gender Equality" organised by Goa University in collaboration with International Centre, Goa. The Gender Champions had carried placards with unique slogans about gender equality originally written by them to be displayed at the ICG as a mark of "silent protest against gender-biased and discriminatory practices" at the event. - 7.4 Contribution to environmental awareness / protection
  - As a part of Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, 40 sincere student volunteers of our NSS units are nominated as class monitors. Orientation programme for class monitors was conducted so as to familiarize them with the role to be played and accountability attached with it. The role of class monitor is to monitor the cleanliness in the class on hourly basis of their respective 20 classrooms. Teachers are kept in charges of each of the classes, to ensure that classes are neat and tidy. The members of the non teaching staff are allotted various facilities in the college to ensure they are kept neat and clean.
  - An oath of Swachata was taken by the NSS Volunteers ON 1<sup>st</sup> August 2017 on the backdrop of 'SwachataPakhwada' wherein 240 NSS Volunteers with six program officers took the oath of Swachata.
  - An intensive campus cleaning activity was organized by the NSS Unit wherein 365 NSS Volunteers cleaned the campus on two days. As a part of Swachh Bharat Pakhwada areas of college such as garden, laws, passage and surroundings were cleaned. The weeds were taken out and the waste material like plastic and paper were cleaned.
  - The NSS volunteers cleaned the lawns between 4th to 6th August 2017 where in area equivalent to 200 square meters was cleaned by taking out weeds. Waste items like plastic and paper were also cleaned.
  - 120 Volunteers of NSS unit cleaned library equivalent to 200 square meters between 1<sup>st</sup> August to 6<sup>th</sup> August 2017.

- NSS Volunteers of MES College visited the Railway station area of Vasco-da-gama railway station with an intention to clean the area. As many as 38 NSS Volunteers cleaned the railway station area from 2: 30 pm to 4: 30 pm wherein the polythene bags, chocolate wrappers, and such plastic waste was collected. An area of 14000 square meters was cleaned.
- A total of 46 Volunteers of NSS Unit cleaned 3200 square meter area in the premises of St. Andrew Church Vasco on 5<sup>th</sup> August 2017 as a part of SwachataPakhwada.
- As a part of SwachataPakhwada NSS Volunteers of MES College did the cleaning at COOJ Mental Health Foundation at Khariwada, Vasco.
- As a part of SwachataPakhwada a total of 48 NSS Volunteers distributed 2400 paper bags in the Municipal market of Vasco on 7<sup>th</sup> August 2017. A total 120 vegetable and fruit sellers were distributed free paper bags and oriented to stop the use of plastic.
- 42 NSS volunteersdistributed 2000 paper bags in the adopted village of Zari on 8<sup>th</sup> August 2017. Volunteers covered 22 shops and 40 households in this program.
- The NSS Volunteers visited 58 households and 24 shops to create awareness about cleanliness in the adopted village of Zari on 9<sup>th</sup> August 2017.
- In line with celebration of Swachh Bharat Pakhwada, the NSS Unit of M.E.S.College of Arts & Commerce, Zuarinagar-Goa, organized a talk in its adopted village 'Zari' on the topic "Sanitation, Cleanliness, Health, Hygiene and Epidemics" at YallalingeshwarShardaMandir High School, Zuarinagar on 11<sup>th</sup> August 2017. The programme aimed creating awareness among the locals through their wards studying at YallalingeshwarShardaMandir High School in adopted village 'Zari'. A total of 140 students attended the session including N.S.S.Volunteers of the college.
- A rally on Swach Bharat was organized by the NSS Unit of MES College on 15<sup>th</sup> August 2017 after the flag hoisting ceremony as a part of SwachataPakhwada. A total of 345 volunteers participated in the rally. The rally was initiated at the campus of MES College which concluded in the adopted village Zari. Volunteers participated with placards and recited various slogans on Swachh Bharat.
- As a part of 'Swachata hi sewa' program the NSS Unit of MES College organized an awareness talk on cleanliness and lifestyle disorders for the NSS Volunteers on 27<sup>th</sup> September 2017. Dr. SnehaBhagwat, a renowned ayurvedic doctor from Margao interacted with the volunteers about cleanliness.
- NSS Unit of MES College organized a talk on the civic responsibilities and cleanliness for the NSS Volunteers on 26<sup>th</sup> September 2017, as a part of 'Swachata hi sewa' initiative of the Government of India. Mr. Rolland Martins delivered a talk on responsibilities of an every citizen of the nation to keep his surrounding clean.
- NSS Unit of MES College with 230 NSS Volunteers carried out an intensive anti-plastic drive in the
  college locality. The NSS Volunteers lifted the plastic waste from the area amounting to 34 bags. The
  waste was handed over to the local Village Panchayat.
- The Resource Management Cell launched the project 'Re Paper' bin wherein waste paper generated at various points on the campus is collected and is then being recycled. This paper is being sent to Ms.RoshanBandekar, an entrepreneur who owns a unit making bags, envelopes, etc. from handmade paper. The paper collected from MES College is being used to make gift bags.
- Roof top rain water harvesting plant is in function in college.
- Every year new trees are planted on the campus.
- The Vermi composting plant is functioning well

- Peer learning has been formalized and is being documented. This is a process wherein an academically bright student teaches a group of academically weaker students.
- The College has registered for the National Digital Library provided by the MHRD.
- Sanskrit classes commenced in January 2018. The teacher, Shri. Hardik Dinesh BhaiBhat, has been appointed by the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed University), New Delhi established under the auspices of the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Government of India. We have got permission from the Directorate of Higher Education, Government of Goa. The College is the Centre for these classes. 11 students have registered for this course.
- The Entrepreneurship HUB of MES College has been formed to inform, motivate and guide those students, who wish to explore the entrepreneurial way of life. The HUB organized a program titled 'Pursue your Passion' on 16<sup>th</sup> January 2018 where students interacted with two personalities who have decided to pursue their passion. MsShrutiJaiswalZuwarker, has founded 'ROOHSERVE', an organization that helps weavers in Varanasi to gain access to national and international markets by connecting them to well-known brands.
- The Entrepreneurship HUB, in collaboration with 'Goa State Innovation Council', Government of Goa, organised a program on 21st February 2018. The speakers were Mr SudipFaldesai, Mr RajaramParsekar, Mr SushantSurlakar and Mr TusharSawant. They addressed the students on topics such as Introduction of Goa State Innovation Council &Bootcamp, How to become a Tech Startup Entrepreneur? Process of setting up an Enterprise, Ideation, Planning, execution, etc. and Various Government Funds and Schemes assistance for starting up.
- The Department of Commerce conducted a certificate course on Tally ERP 9 with GST. The course was for 30 hours (i.e. 2 credits) and was conducted from 7th February 2018 to 19th March 2018. 21 students registered for the course.
- The Department of Commerce organized a Financial literacy Programme from 22nd to 29th January 2018. Four BCom students and two BA (Economics) students visited five higher secondary schools and addressed the students on basic financial matters such as opening of bank accounts, how to write a cheque,etc. These 6 students were awarded with certificates of appreciation on 26th March 2018.
- Talks by eminent personalities were organized, namely,
  - o The BBA Department organized a guest lecture by Rear Admiral ArunPrakash (retd.) on 'Sino-Indian Relations: The Doklam Issue' on 31<sup>st</sup> July 2017. Students from all departments attended this lecture.
  - The Value Education Cell of M.E.S College of Arts & Commerce, Zuarinagar conducted a talk on 4th of September 2017. The guest speaker was Mr.NasirTahasalder, a former student and tax consultant from the Heartfullness Organization, an N.G.O. working to create awareness among people highlighting values in life. It also empowers people with techniques to use on themselves to enhance the values in them.
  - o A talk on Life Values was organized by the Value Education Cell of the College. The speaker was Shri Ashok Parab, an expert on Neuro Linguistic Programming.
  - o The Health Club organized a talk for the female students on 'Health Issues, Diet and Preventive Measures' on 13<sup>th</sup> September 2017. Dr.MayurPai, a renowned gynaecologist, was the guest speaker.

# 5. Improvements in teachinglearning and evaluation

Internal academic audit was conducted for B.A./B.Com. programmes with the objective of improving the quality of teaching-learning-evaluation.

Bridge Courses in Economics (one week duration) and Commerce (one week duration) were conducted for the benefit of first year students.

The ISA papers have been shown to the students.

An orientation programme was organized for the students of B.A. / B.Com. Semester V in order to equip them with research skills for their projects.

A talk on Research Methodology was organized for B.A.Sem V students. Dr. Vijay Viegas, Assoc Prof, PG Dept of Psychology, St. Xaviers College of Arts, Science & Commerce, Mapusa, was the resource person.

New methodologies have been introduced in the teaching-learning process. Peer learning has been introduced for some courses and the same has been documented.

All teachers submitted their teaching plans and compliance of teaching plans to the IQAC.

Learning outcomes have been designed for all courses/subjects

The IQAC organized a one -week State-level Faculty Development Programme on 'Professional and Self-Development for College Teachers' from 16th October 2017 to 21st October 2017. Dr.SujataSatapathy, Associate Professor, Clinical Psychology, Department Psychiatry, AIIMS, New Delhi Dr.MeghaDeuskar, Head, Department of Psychology, Fergusson College, Pune have consented to be the resource persons for this Faculty Development Programme. The workshop was organized with a view to build interpersonal, leadership, communication and conflict management skills in college teachers and o impart knowledge, skills and attitudes on effective mentorship. 41 participants from 7 colleges across the

state participated in the Programme.

The IOAC organized a national seminar titled 'Quality Enhancement and Assurance in Higher Education Institutions in the context of the Revised NAAC Assessment and Accreditation Framework' on 9th April 2018. Dr. SiddalingaSwamy, (Coordinator, Quality Assurance Cell, Department of Collegiate Education, Bengaluru) was the Chief Guest and keynote speaker. He also addressed the participants on Innovative Methodologies in the Teaching-Learning process. Prof. ManikraoSalunkhe, Honourable Vice Chancellor, BharatiVidyapeeth Deemed University, Pune was the Chief Guest for the valedictory function. The other resource persons included Dr. ShirishChindhade (NAAC Assessor and Former Principal, M.U. College, Pimpri, Pune), Prof. PranabMukhopadhyay (IQAC Coordinator, Goa University) and Prof. V.R. Shirgurkar (NAAC Assessor and Former Principal, ParvatibaiChowgule College, Margao, Goa). The seminar was organized with a view to acquaint the participants with the Revised NAAC Assessment and Accreditation Framework. The seminar focussed on Documentation for the Revised System of Assessment and Accreditation by NAAC, Benchmarking and Goal Setting Innovative methodologies in the teachinglearning process, and Research, Innovations and Best Practices.

6. Improvements instudent support and progression

The Placement Cell has been very active.10 companies, namely, Vedanta Ltd., Axis Bank- Panjim Branch, Axis Bank- Vasco Branch, ARZ- NGO, ICICI Bank Sales Academy, ICICI Prudential, Numadic, Open Destinations, Cresendo Educational Innovations and Tata Consultancy Services visited the MES College Campus. 238 students participated in the interviews and 70 students were selected.

45 Final Year BA and BCom students (25 from Commerce, 15 from Psychology and 5 from Economics) underwent a one-month internship in May-June 2018 as per the circular received from the Directorate of Higher Education, Government of Goa.

A Language Study Centre has been set up.A Certificate Course in Spoken French was conducted. 12 students

registered for the course. Sanskrit classes commenced in January 2018. The teacher, Shri. Hardik Dinesh Bhai Bhat, has been appointed by the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed University), New Delhi established under the auspices of the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Government of India. We have got permission from the Directorate of Higher Education, Government of Goa. The College is the Centre for these classes. 11 students registered for this course.

A Student Education Fund was initiated for needy students in May 2016, wherein the teaching staff have voluntarily made contributions for the benefit of needy students.

The Department of Physical Education and Sports and Women Cell of M.E.S. College, in collaboration with the Police Sports Cell, GRP, Altinho, Panaji, Goaorganized a 6 day self-defence workshop for college girls. Mr SirajKhan, along with 6 members imparted the training to 60 girl students of the college.

The Department of Commerce organized a Financial literacy Programme from 22<sup>nd</sup> to 29<sup>th</sup> January 2018. Four BCom students and two BA (Economics) students visited five higher secondary schools and addressed the students on basic financial matters such as opening of bank accounts, how to write a cheque,etc. These 6 students were awarded with certificates of appreciation on 26<sup>th</sup> March 2018.

The Department of Konkani conducted a ten-day theatre workshop. 29 students participated in this workshop. The resource persons were the President & Vice President, Tiatr Academy of Goa.

The Department of Physical Education organized the first All Goa Inter-Collegiate X-Country Championship (Men) 2017-18.

The Health Club organized a free medical check-up and haemoglobin check up, which was done by Dr. Mani Tigga and her team from Goa Shipyard Ltd. as part of their CSR. Free medicines were also given to the students.

The Commerce Association of our college organised its Second Business Quiz Competition on 19th September 2017 for Higher Secondary students. 5 Higher Secondary Schools participated for the quiz.

The Health Club organized a competition on 'Healthy Diet' on 14<sup>th</sup> December 2017 Students had to prepare some food item and explain its health benefits and importance in diet. 14 teams participated in this competition.

The Department of Commerce, in collaboration with I-create, organized a five-day programme on 'Change Your Mindset' from 17<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> August 2017. 34 students attended the programme.

The NSE Online Courses Committee was formed with the intention to create awareness among the students of the NCFM courses (NSE's certification in Financial Markets) of NSE (National stock Exchange) and encourage them to join such courses which will add value to their resume.Sixteen students of B.A. and B.Com. (4 BA and 12 BCOM) have registered online for the NCFM courses in the following two modules: Commercial Banking in India – a Beginners Module andMutual Funds . Seven students appeared for the exam, out of which one student,Mr. Nitin Kumar Shukla from S.Y.B.Com., cleared the online exam in the module Mutual Funds.

# 7. Improvement in infrastructure

The stationery shop was inaugurated on 20<sup>th</sup> March 2018. It is being run by our former student, Mr. Shankar Kawthankar, who is differently abled, and his visually-challenged partner, Ms. Sonia Shankar.. The shop was inaugurated by our B.A. Semester II student, Ms. Vinita Bicholkar, who is physically challenged.

Under RUSA the following has been completed/is in progress:

Repair and renovation: Rooftop and false ceiling work, fitting of grills and aluminium windows has been completed inclassrooms in Block I.

Purchase of equipments: Fixing LED tubelights, fans and electrical fittings in Block I, electronic noticeboards, CCTVs, speakers in classrooms, staff room and corridors,

New furniture for library, IT Laboratory, Seminar hall, chairs in staff room and tables and chairs in classrooms Levelling of pathways connecting Blocks I, III and IV New construction on the top floor of Block IV is in progress.

Library automation has been completed in October 2017.

An Economics Lab has been set up

Fourwi-fi connections have been upgraded with high-speed internet connectivity. The BBA Department discontinued the BSNL Broadband connectivity of copper wire in 2017 and opted for new BSNL Broadband connection with Fibre Optic cables. The Fibre Broadband unlimited plan for FTTH is commissioned. The plan is FIBRO-COMBO-ULD-4999-CS66-MONTHLY up to 100 MBPS till 200GB, up to 2 MBPS beyond

The BCA Department had Rail wire Internet connection with a speed of 4 MBPSfrom September 2016 to December 2017. From February 2018 onwards, the Fibre Broadband unlimited plan for FTTH has been commissioned. The plan is FIBRO-COMBO-ULD-4999-CS66-MONTHLY up to 100 MBPS till 200GB, up to 2 MBPS beyond.

The B.A./ B.Com.and M.A./ M.Com.programmes have internet connections of up to 80 MBPS. The plan is FIBRO-COMBO-ULD-3999-CS65-MONTHLY

After analyzing the feedback obtained from students and parents, a new canteen contractor was appointed.

# 8.Innovations and Best Practices

A special induction programme was conducted for new faculty so as to make them familiar with the ethos of the college.

The Women's Cell 'Jyoti' conducted a workshop on making designer paper bags. 30 students enrolled for this workshop. The resource person was Mrs. Anita Thorat.

Students who secured Distinction at the B.A./B.Com./B.C.A./B.B.A. April 2017 examinations were felicitated on 16<sup>th</sup> September 2017.

The 'MES Entrepreneurship Hub'has been formed to encourage students to explore their entrepreneurial talent. About 35 students have registered for the same.

Teachers were felicitated on 6<sup>th</sup> November 2017 for their academic achievements and for securing 100% results of students in their respective classes. Non-teaching staff were also felicitated for the first time.

The Parent Teachers Association of M. E. S. College of Arts & Commerce in collaboration with the Lions' Club of Cortalim have taken the initiative to promote menstrual sanitation and proper disposal of menstrual waste by sponsoring a Vending machine for sanitary napkins and incinerators for eco-friendly disposal of menstrual waste in all the women's washrooms in the college.

The NSS Unit of MES College organized 'Vanamohotsav' on 11<sup>th</sup> August 2017 in the college campus in collaboration with an NGO called 'Friends of SatishSonak'. As many as 28 trees were planted as a part of this program. Plants like Imli, Jamun, rain tree and such seasonal trees were planted.

The Resource Management Cell has launched the project 'Re Paper' bin wherein waste paper generated at various points on the campus is collected and is then being recycled. This paper is being sent to Ms.RoshanBandekar, an entrepreneur who owns a unit making bags, envelopes, etc. from handmade paper. The paper collected from MES College is being used to make gift bags.

The appreciation awards ceremony was held on 24<sup>th</sup> March 2018. Students who won prizes at state and national events were felicitated by the Chief Guest, Adv.

DyaneshKarpe who was an ex-student of our college.
The Gender Champions initiative has been launched by Goa University under the Ministry of Women and Child Development and Ministry of HRD. The Nodal Teacher of M.E.S. College for this initiative is Ms. PoorwaNaik.

#### Part B 1.3 Feedback from Stakeholders

Feedback was obtained from parents and students. A brief description of the methods followed for eliciting feedback is as follows:

- (i) Parents: Feedback was obtained from parents at the time of collection of semester-end examination mark-sheets. In order to sensitize parents about the academic progress of their wards, results are handed over to parents of students of B.A./B.Com. by respective mentors. The parents were asked to fill in the questionnaire provided to them. The feedback form/questionnaire covered questions pertaining to college infrastructure facilities such as career guidance, student mentoring library, canteen, etc. and counselling, sport/cultural/extracurricular activities, extension activities, holistic education etc. On analyzing the feedback of the parents, necessary action is taken wherever necessary. The parents are also requested to visit the college every month to interact with the subject teachers and mentors so as to know about their wards academic performance, discipline and attendance in the class.
- (ii) Students: The students convey their grievances, if any, to faculty members, mentors, Vice-Principal, Principal, as well as to the professional Counsellor who is available thrice a week. The students also communicate their feedback during College Council meetings. The feedback received from students covers issues like canteen facilities, occasional non-functioning of fan/tube-light, participation in inter-collegiate events, etc.

In addition to the above, online feedback of students is also obtained through a specially designed faculty evaluation form. The student provides feedback about the faculty on five broad parameters, namely, discipline, subject knowledge, imparting knowledge, use of teaching aids and teachers attitude towards students. Based on the faculty evaluation by students, each teacher provides a summary (in a specified format) to the Head of Department, who further submits a report to the IQAC. The Principal, after going through the same, accordingly redresses the matter wherever the need arises.

This year, all the B.A./B.Com. students provided online institutional feedback. This feedback was analysed by the IQAC. The IQAC prepared a consolidated report and suggestions provided by the students have been considered. For instance, after analyzing the feedback obtained from students and parents, a new canteen contractor was appointed. Further, fourwi-fi connections have been upgraded with high-speed internet connectivity. The B.B.A.Department discontinued the BSNL Broadband connectivity of copper wire in 2017 and opted for new BSNL Broadband connection with Fibre Optic cables. The Fibre Broadband unlimited plan for FTTH is

commissioned. The plan is FIBRO-COMBO-ULD-4999-CS66-MONTHLY up to 100 MBPS till 200GB, up to 2 MBPS beyond

The B.C.A. Department had Rail wire Internet connection with a speed of 4 MBPS from September 2016 to December 2017. From February 2018 onwards, the Fibre Broadband unlimited plan for FTTH has been commissioned. The plan is FIBRO-COMBO-ULD-4999-CS66-MONTHLY up to 100 MBPS till 200GB, up to 2 MBPS beyond.

The B.A./ B.Com.and M.A./ M.Com.programmes have internet connections of up to 80 MBPS. The plan is FIBRO-COMBO-ULD-3999-CS65-MONTHLY

Feedback about the curriculum was also obtained from the B.A. and B.Com. Semester I and II students. This has been analysed by the IQAC.

### 7.3 Best Practices of the Institution

The College has a number of Best Practices. The two best practices are as follows:

## (i) 'Go-Green' initiative:

The 'Go-Green' initiative at M.E.S. College of Arts and Commerce, Zuarinagar, Goa, aims at arriving at a culture of conservation in and around the campus. The objective of the 'Go-Green' initiative is to sensitize students and the teaching community to conserve the natural resources for future generations. Emphasis is laid on several environmental aspects ranging from recycling to energy conservation. Some of the initiatives taken in this direction are as follows;

- (a) The NSS Unit of MES College organized 'Vanamohotsav' on 11<sup>th</sup> August 2017 in the college campus in collaboration with an NGO called 'Friends of SatishSonak'. As many as 28 trees were planted as a part of this program. Plants like Imli, Jamun, rain tree and such seasonal trees were planted.
- (b)As a part of SwachataPakhwada a total of 48 NSS Volunteers distributed 2400 paper bags in the Municipal market of Vasco on 7<sup>th</sup> August 2017. A total 120 vegetable and fruit sellers were distributed free paper bags and oriented to stop the use of plastic. 42 NSS volunteers distributed 2000 paper bags in the adopted village of Zari on 8<sup>th</sup> August 2017. Volunteers covered 22 shops and 40 households in this program.
- (c)The Resource Management Cell has launched the project 'Re Paper' bin wherein waste paper generated at various points on the campus is collected by the daily wage workers, stored and then sent for recycling. This paper is being sent to Ms.RoshanBandekar, an entrepreneur who owns a unit making bags, envelopes, etc. from handmade paper. The paper collected from MES College is being used to make gift bags.
- (d) The College has installed LED bulbs and tubelights in the classrooms and corridors.
- (e) Electronic display of notices and information of various courses and activities was initiated during the academic year 2017-18. Further, notices and letters are sent to faculty by e-mail.

### (ii) Internal Academic Audit:

The process of internal academic audit for the B.A. and B.Com. programmes has been initiated with the objective of improving the quality of teaching-learning-evaluation. The college appointed external subject experts for this purpose. The teachers maintained the documents in their respective course files pertaining to teaching plan and compliance of teaching plan, question papers of intra-semester assessment and semester-end examinations, students' cumulative

attendance and analysis of students' feedback. The documents were presented for every paper taught for both semesters for the academic year 2017-18. The external subject experts examined these documents thoroughly and gave their valuable suggestions on the checklist forms. The process of internal academic audit was conducted from 26<sup>th</sup> April 2018 to 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2018.
