

1. (a) Education - A Life long mission

Murgaon Education Society was established in 1971 with the noble goal of providing educational facilities at Vasco-da-Gama and in other parts of Goa. It has been the endeavour of M.E.S. College to develop professional skills among its students and to provide a select core of leadership qualities. The college has become over the years, a positive force for national and global development. The first educational institution set up by the Murgaon Education Society was the College of Arts and Commerce, which was established at Vasco-da-Gama in 1972. This was also the first composite Arts and Commerce College in the state of Goa to be affiliated to the University of Mumbai and then to Goa University. The college was shifted to its present Zuarinagar campus in June 1985.

The college seeks to bring about an all round integrated development of the intellectual, moral and physical faculties of its students, so that they can become self reliant, play a positive role in the nation building and provide leadership to the society in various walks of life. Pursuit of excellence is the motto of the college.

(b) National and International recognition

(A) For B.A./B.Com. Semester I&II (in First year):

A student seeking admission should duly fill in the prescribed form and meet the Principal / Vice Principal accompanied by the parent / guardian with the following documents and submit the same to the office:

- 1) Duly filled Application Form
- 2) Identity Card Slip
- 3) Anti-Ragging Undertaking Form.
- 4) Original marksheet of HSSC / Equivalent examination and two attested photocopies of the same
- 5) Original Copy of H. S. S. C. Leaving Certificate
- 6) Attested photocopy of Caste Certificate issued by a competent authority (if applicable)
- 7) Eligibility Certificate (in original) issued by Goa University (for those students who have passed std XII or any other equivalent examination through any other recognized Board other than Goa Board if applicable)
- 8) Six copies of recent passport size photographs
- 9) Undertaking for attendance

- B. To be eligible for admission to semester-I of the Three Year Course leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Science Not Applicable.
- C. A candidate not covered under any of the above categories but desirous of seeking admission to the said course may apply to the College. However, the Registrar along with Dean of concerned Faculty and Chairperson(s) of Board(s) of studies of concerned subjects shall decide the eligibility.
- D. A candidate admitted for Semester-I shall be deemed eligible for admission to Semester II.
- E. A candidate migrating from another recognized University and desirous of direct admission to Semester-II may be considered for admission provided he/ she has cleared/ passed First Term/ Semester-I examination of that University with those subjects for which admission is sought and undertakes to successfully complete the other compulsory courses of Semester –I.

- (C) A candidate not covered under any of the above categories but desirous of seeking admission to the said course may apply to the College. However, the Registrar along with Dean of concerned Faculty and Chairperson(s) of Board(s) of studies of concerned subjects shall decide the eligibility.
- (D) A candidate admitted for Semester-I shall be deemed eligible for admission to Semester-II.
- (E) A candidate migrating from another recognized University and desirous of direct admission to Semester-II may be considered for admission provided he/ she has cleared/ passed First Term/ Semester-I examination of that University with those subjects for which admission is sought and undertakes to successfully complete the other compulsory courses of Semester –I.

2.2 Eligibility for admission to Semester - III & IV (in the second year) B.A./B.Com. Programme:

- (A) A candidate who has requisite attendance for Semester I and Semester II shall be eligible for admission to Semester III.
- (B) A candidate migrating from any other recognized University may be considered for admission to Semester III of the B.A./ B. Com. provided:

However, the result of Semester IV shall be withheld if the candidate does not fulfil these conditions.

It is not intended to cover the actual expenditure incurred by the students and will be paid as per the guidelines of the University.

National Service Scheme, popularly known as NSS is a voluntary community service scheme for the youth studying in the higher educational institutions. NSS was launched by the Government of India in 1969 in the birth centenary year of Mahatma Gandhi. This initiative is sponsored by the Ministry of Sports and Youth Affairs.

The motto of NSS is 'Not me, but you' which symbolizes the self-less service for the society. The aim of NSS is to bring out a positive social and political change in the lives of youth by developing the various dimensions of their personality. Students gain knowledge in the classroom but as an NSS Volunteer they gain wisdom and a pragmatic approach in life, which is quite useful to succeed in today's era of competition. The NSS volunteers are made socially, emotionally, politically and environmentally sensitive so that they not only achieve

the greater heights of success in life but also contribute significantly towards the process of national building.

NSS Unit of MES College is one of the largest and a most vibrant NSS Unit in the state of Goa with an allotted strength of 600 Volunteers and 6 Program Officers. NSS organizes a wide spectrum of activities including personality development workshops, leadership programs, consumer protection programs, self-defence workshops for girls, blood donation program, Jalyatra, trekking, yoga and meditation training programs, road safety talks, HIV-AIDS awareness talks, tree plantation and various such programs which aim at polishing the various aspects of a student's personality.

Every year the NSS Unit of MES College organizes A 7 day residential 'NSS Annual Special Camp' in a rural area in Goa where in more than 100 NSS Volunteers participate. In the camp the NSS Volunteers not only try to understand the different aspects of rural life but strive to do community service and bring out a positive change in the lives of villagers by doing community works like watershed management works, anti-plastic drive, health camp and social awareness.

Successful completion of the NSS activities is rewarded with the grace marks and certificates depending upon the nature of activities performed by a student NSS volunteer. The enrolment for the NSS takes place only in the beginning of the academic year which is notified to the students by a notice. Assistant Professor Mr. Dattaprasad D. Shirgurkar is presently heading the NSS Unit as the NSS Program Officer in Charge. All the students of B.A., B.Com. and B.C.A. are encouraged to enrol for the NSS.

NSS Certificate

A student joining N.S.S. shall complete 240 hours of NSS regular activity over a period of four semesters completing 60 hours of regular N.S.S. activity per semester and one 7 Day Residential N.S.S. Special Camp. On successful completion of the above activities, the N.S.S. volunteer shall become eligible to receive a 240 hours completion certificate, issued by Directorate of sports and Youth Affairs, Campal, Panaji, Goa.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

NCC Navy

MES College of Arts and Commerce, Zuarinagar- Goa is one of the five colleges which have NCC Naval Division in Goa. Naval NCC is available

for boys (SD) and Girls (SW) for regular bonafied college students. Fresh regular students having 18 to 23 age with physically and mental fitness are eligible for joining NCC. The students must also meet the prescribed medical standards. Students can join as per the vacancy availability in the institution. The selection is done generally in last week of month of June by conducting interview, physical fitness, presentation, talent search etc.

NCC Naval provides three year training for "C" certificate exams and two year for "B" certificate exams. Every cadet who completes 75% weekly parades out of 120 with two camps is eligible for "C" certificate exams and 75% attendance with one camp for "B" certificate exams. Drill , Arms drill, Weapon training, Warfare tactics, Field craft, NCC organizations, Leadership, Personality development and Environment and ecology, Hygiene and sanitation, Civil defence, Disaster management, Social services. Trained navy instructors, officers and NCC officers cover the syllabus. Free SSB guidance is also provided to interested and deserving cadets.

Besides regular syllabus training is provided by deputing students for various Local, National and International camps are also organized for the cadets throughout the year. Annual training camp, Ship attachment camps , Nausainik camp, Republic Day camp, National Integration and Special National Integration camp, Basic and advance leadership camps , Tracking , Mountaineering, Snow and Water skiing, Para jumping , Youth Exchange Programme are some of the important camps of NCC organized for intensive training camps for cadets.

NCC Naval provides uniform, washing allowance, refreshments during parade, T.A., D.A. for attending camp, free messing and boarding during camps, for cadets. Except these NCC and other organization like Sahara provides scholarships to NCC cadets.

There is a special entry schemes for "C" certificate passed NCC cadets in defense forces to join as a Commissioned Officer. Special reservation for "C" certificate NCC cadets in all the courses of Indian Military Academy, Indian Naval Academy, Indian Air Force Academy, Officers Training Academy is also given. Special weightage and reservation is provided to all NCC "C" and "B" certificate passed cadets in armed forces, central paramilitary forces and all the states police forces. Weightage and reservation in admission to Universities and Colleges is also given to the NCC cadets outside Goa. Students are also eligible to

obtain the grace mark for all semester examination as per Goa University ordinance. Private sector including corporate houses like Reliance, Sahara, Vedanta have special entry schemes and provide large job opportunity for NCC cadets.

Students are advised to contact to the Associate NCC Officer of College to know more about enrolment procedure in NCC in beginning of Semester I.

NCC Army (Boys)

NCC not only moulds a person physically but also mentally and spiritually, imbibes the four cardinals:

- 1. Be punctual
- 2. Obey with a smile
- 3. Tell no lies and make no excuses
- 4. Work hard and without fuss

Where one follows it with his own charisma

Aims of NCC

- 1. To develop character, comradeship, discipline, leadership, secular outlook, spirit of adventure, sportsmenship and ideas of selfless service amongst the youth of the country.
- 2. To create a human resource of organised, trained and motivated youth to provide leadership in all walks of life and always available for the service of the nation.
- 3. To provide a suitable environment to motivate the youth to take up in the career in the Armed Forces.

NCC Army (Girls)

In order to inculcate national spirit and discipline among students the girls wing of NCC was introduced. The Senior Wing cadets (Girls).NCC army wing was started in college in 1983, with an aim to inculcate discipline, patriotism and other desirable qualities in the minds of students. The current strength is 52. The troop is presently commanded by caretaker Asst. Prof. Ms Swati Shigaonkar, Department of Commerce.

Training: As a part of Institutional training cadets are trained in basic military aspects like Physical fitness, Drill, Map reading, weapon

training etc. Cadets are also trained in other useful topics like body language, interview skills, group discussion etc. Various adventurous and social service activities are conducted every year. Assistance to civil authorities is provided on special occasions.

Camps: The cadets are encouraged to participate in Youth Exchange Programme at International level, Republic Day Camp and All India ThalSainik Camp at New Delhi. Cadets can avail an opportunity to participate in Various National Integration camps, Trekking camps, Army attachment camps, firing camps, Rock climbing Training camps, Combined Annual Training camps etc.

(iii) Associations:

College Council:

The college council comprises of elected, nominated representatives of the students from B. A., B. Com., B. C. A., B. B. A. (General) & B. B. A. (Shipping & Logistics) respectively. The members of the council are elected by the college electorate comprising of all the bonafide students of the college. The council will deliberate and deal with the welfare of the student. **The college council consists of certain associations such as Art and Culture, Debating, Literary and Sports** which aim at developing the artistic, debating, literary and other creative talents among the students.

Any member of the college council can be removed/disqualified by the Principal in case he/she fails to perform his/her duties or if he /she acts in a manner not consonant with the aims and objectives of the college council.

No person shall be invited to address any meeting in the college without the prior permission of the Principal.

Topics for debates, discussion, symposium etc. organized in the college should be approved by the Principal or his nominees, in advance. The activities of the associations are exclusively meant for the bonafide students and no involvement of outsiders is permitted.

13. Code of Conduct:

- 1. The College expects the students to conduct themselves with dignity, decency and decorum inside and outside its premises. They will not engage in any such act which will bring disrepute to the college.
- 2. Attendance at lectures, practicals, tests and examinations is compulsory. Absence at a single lecture, will be considered absence for the whole day. Minimum attendance of 75% per semester is compulsory.
- 3. Students have to strictly abide by all rules and regulations framed from time to time by the Principal or by the persons authorised by him/her. Disobedience, misconduct, misbehaviour and violation of the rules and regulations will entail punishment including expulsion from the college.
- 4. In every matter relating to the college, the decision of the Principal shall be final and binding upon every student.
- 5. The college is an academic body and hence the society at large expects it to conform to high standards of discipline, integrity, academic excellence and intellectual honesty. Every student should live up to this expectation, without forgetting that rights also imply duties.
- 6. A Fine of Rs. 50/- shall be collected from the students as punishment for not wearing Identity Cards within the campus.
- 7. Students are expected to be seated in their respective classrooms at the stroke of the first bell and wait for the teacher. During lecture hours students are not permitted to loiter around the corridors. If a teacher is on leave, alternate arrangements will be made to engage the class.
- 8. Loss of an identity Card must be reported to the College Office Immediately. A duplicate card will be issued on payment of the prescribed fee.
- 9. Students shall adhere to the code of conduct in a manner worthy of the college. Indecent dressing such as plunging necklines, low waist jeans, torn jeans, short T-shirts/shirts, miniskirts, slits, sleeveless displaying armpits, displaying of navel or underwear is prohibited and shall invite punishment in addition to fine.
- 10. Due care of the college property has to be taken by the student/s. Damage to college property, disfiguring the walls, portraits, doors, windows, breaking the furniture, scribbling on the furniture, writing objectionable things & / or trying to cause any harm to the person & / or property of the college & / or students will amount to serious breach of discipline & misconduct & is punishable individually or collectively. In

- addition to the punishment they will have to pay for the damage. Littering in the campus is strictly prohibited.
- 11. Students are restrained from communicating any information or writing or help in writing anything about the college to the press and social media that would damage the repute & affect the status of the college & prove harmful in any way.
- 12. Deliberate failure to perform the required number of experiments and maintaining a practical journal/file/assignment/project reports unjustified absence from exams, etc can seriously prejudice the student's record.
- 13. Students are forbidden to organize or attend any meeting within the college of collect money for any purpose or to circulate among the students any notice or petition of any kind or paste it on the college notice board/walls without prior written permission of the principal.
- 14. Smoking, chewing pan, chewing gum, consumption of any narcotic, alcoholic substance etc in the classrooms and on the campus is strictly prohibited.
- 15. In case of illness, a student must apply for leave and produce a medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner within seven days of resuming / attending the classes.
- 16. Students must read the College Notice Board regularly.
- 17. Students must not attend classes other than their own without the permission of the Principal.
- 18. The students must in no way disturb the orderly functioning of the college and the classes
- 19. No students is allowed to collect contributions in money or kind without obtaining a prior permission from the Principal
- 20. No visitors/outsiders are allowed to meet the students in the college without the permission of the Principal.
- 21. The college reserves the right to withhold the final examination results of those students who fail to clear their dues (sports, breakage, damages, etc) and return library books and other college, items within the notified time.
- 22. Insubordination to any teacher or to any college authorities, use of indecent

- language, misbehavior or misconduct is liable for disciplinary action as per the rules.
- 23. No student will accompany with him/her any unauthorized person in the college premises &/or canteen or allow him/her to use any college premises &/or property.
- 24. Parents/Guardians are advised to contact the college authorities from time to time in order to appraise themselves of the progress of their wards and their attendance.
- 25. Use of Unfair Means/Mobiles during examination (ISA/SEE) is strictly prohibited. A student, if found guilty, shall be liable for punishment as per the rules prescribed by Goa University.
- 26. Mobiles phones are strictly prohibited on the campus and inside the classroom. If a student is found in possession of a mobile phone in the classrooms during lecture hours/lab sessions the same will be confiscated and returned at the end of the academic year on payment of Rs. 500/- as fine.
- 27. Maintenance of college discipline, adherence to its rules and code of conduct and obedience to the instruction issued from time to time by Principal or other college authorities will be mandatory and binding on each student & violation there to will render the concerned students to appropriate disciplinary action including suspension, expulsion from the college & rustication in accordance with the relevant rules as per the directives of the Goa University and the Guidelines formulated by the College Discipline Committee.
 - 28. No student should interfere with the LCD or any electronic gadgets fitted into the classrooms without the permission and the presence of the teachers concerned or any college authority.
 - 29. Due to paucity of parking space, students are requested to travel by car pool if you are using your own vehicles. The college does not guarantee parking space for four/two wheelers of students and would not be responsible for any damage caused to vehicles.
 - 30. Security personnel or any staff appointed by the Principal will have full authority to check and verify the identity cards of every student and have right to interrogate any student, in view of security concerns of the college.

15. Internal Complaints Committee

Objectives, Roles and Responsibilities of College Internal Complaints Committee

Prevent discrimination and sexual harassment, by promoting gender amity among students and employees;

Here it should be noted that according to the Supreme Court guideline Sexual harassment can be defined as "unwelcome" sexually determined behaviour (whether directly or by implication) as:

- 1. Physical contact and advances;
- 2. Demand or request for sexual favours;
- 3. Sexually coloured remarks;
- 4. Showing pornography; and
- 5. Other unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of a sexual nature. (Vishaka judgment by Supreme Court)

The following is also sexual harassment and is covered by the committee:

- § Eve-teasing
- § Unsavory remarks,
- § Jokes causing or likely to cause awkwardness or embarrassment,
- § Innuendos and taunts,
- § Gender based insults or sexist remarks,
- § Unwelcome sexual overtone in any manner such as over telephone (obnoxious telephone calls) and the like,
- § Touching or brushing against any part of the body and the like,
- § Displaying pornographic or other offensive or derogatory pictures, cartoons, pamphlets or sayings,
- § Forcible physical touch or molestation and
- § Physical confinement against one's will and any other act likely to violate one's privacy.

The Committee shall meet as often as may be needed and appropriate. **Frequency of meeting:** Once in a year (beginning of academic year) and as and when necessary.

It shall be a specialised course involving application of knowledge in solving / analyzing /exploring a real life situation / difficult problem. Students shall undertake such a project under the guidance of a teacher/ faculty member. The topic for the Project Work shall be given in Semester V. Students shall be required to carry out work for the Project during Semesters V & VI. The assessment of the Project will be carried at the end of Semester VI.

The maximum number of seats for each subject for B.A. (Honours) shall be 20. The seats will be allotted on a First Come First Serve basis.

The college conducts the following certificate courses

TALLY ERP .9 WITH GST Objective:

- · To impart basic knowledge about GST.

The students equipped with this software will be able to manage in handling transactions, money flow and interest payments. They will also be able to learn about account management, stock management, purchase order management, stock evaluation, invoicing, dealing with GST categories as per HSN classification and also will be able to calculate GST rates as per business transactions. This course provides hands on experience and practical inputs taking into account the software package. Expert faculty is invited to provide practical training and handling of transactions providing them practical aspects which will help them to get employed.

2) Diploma course in Counselling Technique

The diploma course in counselling technique will be beneficial in acquiring knowledge, skills and training of various counselling techniques essential in becoming skilled counsellors. This course will help students gain an insight and correct their own behaviour and assist others in bringing about a change in their behaviour and problems, thus empowering them with essential skills for developing healthy relationships.

3) Center for Competitive Examinations

MES College has established a Center for Competitive Examinations in December 2018. The Center imparts coaching to the students of all streams of MES College for various competitive examinations. The coaching would help a student to become Custom and Excise Inspector, PSI, PI, Bank Probationary Officer, Sales Tax Inspector, Probationary Officer in LIC or General Insurance Companies, Officer with Indian Railway and a position of an officer in Central or State Government offices.

The centre would also provide the coaching for **CAT, MAT and XAT** exams which help a student to get admission for MBA in a quality **Business School** in India like **IIM, GIM and XLRI**, which will brighten the future prospects of a student.

The college has hired professionally experienced faculty from Triumphant Institute of Management Education Pvt. Ltd. (T.I.M.E.) having more than ten years of experience in the field. The Center not only believes in providing coaching to the students but also provides study material and hold mock tests. Continuous assistance is provided so that a student is benefitted even after graduating from MES College.
