


The B.B.A. (Shipping and Logistics) programme is the first undergraduate programme in India which addresses the commercial and managerial side of the shipping industry. The college has a Research Centre in Sociology. At present, the college has approximately 1606 students and 60 full-time teaching faculty.

The college encourages high academic standards. We instil in our students a passion for learning and acquiring knowledge that they will require to make a positive contribution to the society. The college imparts learner-centric education which aims at the holistic development of the students by developing creative and critical thinking, nurturing innovations and excellence, developing professional skills etc.

Duration:

It is a three-year full time programme. Each year will consist of three terms, there will be an additional summer placement term of six weeks each and at the end of 1st & 2nd year and 4 weeks at the end of third year. Each term will be of approximately 3 months duration inclusive of vacations.

I remember myself as a gawky teenager who had come from science stream to join BBA (which was the inaugural year of the BBA course in Goa) in the year 2000. Frankly, I had joined BBA course as a stop-gap arrangement. As science students, you had to wait for 4 rounds of admissions to see if you can get a medical / engineering / dental / pharma course via Goa Board. But as time went by & under the tutelage of Late Dr. Sreekumar who was the pioneer behind the introduction of BBA course in Goa university we realized that we are standing on the cusp of a revolution in academics. This course was a paradigm shift from the usual classroom methodology which was prevalent at that time. From the usual memorize & rote, we had moved to understand & internalize. Most of our tests involved open book tests, presentations & problem-solving. Hence it was a welcome shift from just filling answer sheets from memory. The ability testing was done by how we could find own solutions to the management problems thrown at us. More importantly, group assignments were the norm. The 2-month industry internship was an On-the-Job experience which very few courses provided at that time. To sum it up I owe it to the BBA course at MES College, for inculcating in me problem solving, leadership, team management, presentation skills & an outlook which made adaptable and relevant for the industry.

Selecting BBA at the graduate level has been the best decision I've taken. Of course credit goes to my father who found out in detail advantages of this course as it was a new course in Goa. Being the 2nd batch, we were the proverbial rabbits in the lab, no complaints though. This course develops the overall personality of a student. It did shape mine. The curriculum is designed in a way to help students to think on their own, which the rote learning method doesn't allow you to. Subjects like Cultural studies, Ethics - widens one's perspective about art/culture/ social welfare/ acceptance of other cultures more openly etc. It helps each one think to own their own which has helped me at my work. Most employers look for candidates who will take responsibility and act, rather than approach the manager for every problem. Stage fear, Presentation skills/ solving cases/ applying concepts learned in practical life, this is something which has stayed with me since my graduation. Grooming is one more aspect, which is of utmost importance in life. Be it the soft skills or mock interviews, dining etiquettes, have been helpful too. As the course promises it equips the students with managerial / leadership skills. I'm glad I chose BBA, as it has certainly helped me horn my hidden skills and learn new things. As a working professional from the shipping industry, I may not have been able to apply learned concepts like statistics/POM, finance in my chosen field. However it's the soft skills, problem-solving attitude polished during BBA days, basic knowledge of subjects which are of paramount importance in corporate life, and I have immensely gained from it.

- (b) Caution Deposit and Security Deposit shall be refunded in full.
- (c) In case of (1) in the table above, 5% of the fees paid by the student, subject to a maximum of Rs. 5,000 shall be deducted as processing charges from the refundable amount.

- (d) Fees shall be refunded to an eligible student within fifteen days from the date of receiving a written application from him/her in this regard.
- (e) The fees of students who have already been admitted to a programme of the University and have paid the fees and are subsequently admitted to another programme shall have to pay the fees for the final admission and claim the refund of fees paid earlier, in which case no administrative charges shall be deducted from fees paid earlier by the student. However, if the fees payable for both the programmes are the same, the fees paid earlier shall be transferred to the final programme where admission is sought.
- (f) All the other cases of refund of the fees will be decided on case to case basis on its merit.

Where "Ci" is the number of Credits of the ith Course and Gi is the grade point scored by the student in the ith Course.

ii. The CGPA is also calculated in the same manner taking into account all the Courses undergone by a student over all the Semesters of a Programme:

$$CGPA = \Sigma (Ci \times Si) / \Sigma Ci$$

Where Si is the SGPA of the ith Semester and Ci is the total number of credits in that Semester.

- (b)The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points and reported in the grade certificate.
- (c)For each Course a student securing 'F' or 'Ab' grade in the Course shall not be entitled to earn any

credits for that Course.

OA-16.4.7 Conversion to Final Grade:

(a)

(i) The CGPA shall be converted to the Final Grade, as shown in the table below:

CGPA	Final Grade
10.0	O (Outstanding)
9.0 - <10	A+(Excellent)
8.0 - < 9.0	A (Very Good)
7.0 - <8.0	B+(Good)
6.0 - <7.0	B (Above Average)
5.0 - < 6.0	C (Average)

<4.0	F (Fail)

(ii)A candidate who fails to earn the required number of Credits to award the Degree shall be declared 'Fail'.

- (b) The CGPA shall be calculated upto two decimal places. If the CGPA is higher than the indicated upper limit in the two decimal digits by a factor of >0.005, then the higher grade shall be awarded. For example, a candidate with CGPA >4.995 will be awarded 'C' grade.
- (c) A candidate who has not earned required Credits to award the Degree as per respective Ordinance shall be given Final Grade 'F' and be declared 'Fail'.

Convocation

Students passing the Third Year of the Degree examination are eligible to receive a DEGREE CERTIFICATE (which is different from the Marks Sheet) from Goa University.

Eligible students should apply for the award of Degree Certificate around December of the previous year, in a prescribed (Convocation) form and pay the convocation fee to the University. Forms can be obtained online or at the University.

Every student passing the Third Year Degree examination is advised to obtain the DEGREE Certificate at the Convocation either in person or in absentia for the reason that is absolutely essential for further studies and equally important for jobs.

CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. In every matter relating to the college, the decision of the Principal shall be final and binding upon every student.
- 2. Attendance for lectures and practicals is compulsory. The minimum requirement for attendance is 75% aggregate and 50% in each course of the respective semester as per Ordinance OA-17 of the Goa University.
- 3. Students have to abide by all the rules and regulations framed from time to time by the Principal or by the persons authorized by him/her.
- 4. Insubordination to any teacher or to any college authorities, use of indecent language, misbehaviour or misconduct is liable for disciplinary action as per the rules.
- 5. Ragging is strictly banned in the college. Any student found indulging in ragging will be severely dealt with, as per UGC Regulations.
- 6. Wearing of Identity card is mandatory for students in the college premises. Loss of an identity card must be reported to the College Office immediately. A duplicate card will be issued on payment of the prescribed fee.
- 7. Students are expected to strictly adhere to lecture timings. The lectures are conducted from 8.15 a.m. to 2.35 p.m. and practicals are conducted up to 5.00 p.m. The college office timings are from 10.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m.
- 8. Damage to college property/reputation in any form is punishable. If found guilty, responsible individual(s) would be liable to pay for the damages in addition to repercussion faced.
- 9. Students are required to adhere to the Examination Ordinance of Goa University. Please refer to the Goa University Ordinance OA-24 available at:

- 10. Students shall require prior permission from the Principal for organizing/involvement in any activity (monetary/non-monetary in nature) in the college premises.
- 11. Consumption and possession of tobacco or alcohol or any form of intoxicant in the college campus is prohibited and punishable.
- 12. A student applying for Medical Leave must produce a medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner within seven days of resuming classes.
- 13. Accompanying of unauthorized personnel in college campus is prohibited and punishable.

- 14. Visitors are required to acquire a visitors' pass while entering the college premises.
- 15. Students are expected to clear/pay their dues (sports, library, other damages etc.) before collecting their results. On failing to do so, the college reserves the right to withhold the Examination result.
- 16. Parents/Guardians are advised to contact the College authorities from time to time in order to apprise themselves of the progress of their wards and their attendance.
- 17. Use of unfair means during examination (ISA/SEE) is strictly prohibited. A student, if found guilty, shall be liable for punishment as per the rules prescribed by Goa University.
- 18. Unauthorized use of mobile phones in class is strictly prohibited. Any student violating this rule shall face disciplinary action.
- 19. Due to paucity of parking space, the College does not guarantee parking space for four/two wheelers for students and would not be responsible for any damage/theft caused to vehicles.
- 20. Security personnel or any staff appointed by the Principal will have full authority to check and verify the identity cards of every student and have right to interrogate any student, in view of security concerns of the college.
- 21. Maintenance of college discipline, adherence to its rules and code of conduct and obedience to the instruction issued from time to time by Principal or other college authorities will be mandatory and binding on each student. Appropriate disciplinary action will be taken which includes suspension/expulsion and rustication as per the directives of Goa University and College Discipline Committee.

It should be noted that according to the Supreme Court guideline Sexual harassment can be defined as "unwelcome" sexually determined behaviour (whether directly or by implication) as:

- 1. Physical contact and advances;
- 2. Demand or request for sexual favours;
- 3. Sexually coloured remarks;
- 4. Showing pornography; and
- 5. Other unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of a sexual nature. (Vishaka judgment by Supreme Court)
 - The following is also sexual harassment and is covered by the Committee:
- Eve-teasing
- Unsavory remarks,
- Jokes causing or likely to cause awkwardness or embarrassment,
- Innuendos and taunts,

- Gender based insults or sexist remarks,
- Unwelcome sexual overtone in any manner such as over telephone (obnoxious telephone calls) and the like.
- Touching or brushing against any part of the body and the like,
- Displaying pornographic or other offensive or derogatory pictures, cartoons, pamphlets or sayings,
- Forcible physical touch or molestation and
- Physical confinement against one's will and any other act likely to violate one's privacy. The Committee shall meet as often as may be needed and appropriate.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Students are advised to take part in various extra—curricular activities.

1. Department of Physical Education and Sports

The Department of Physical Education and Sports of M.E.S College aims at all round development of each and every student through the participation in various games and sports. The Department organizes various activities and intra-murals such as Inter-class Tournaments, Athletic Meet, which provides an opportunity to the students to showcase their

talents. The College also participates in other extra-murals and competitive games held by the Goa University and other associations and Institutions.



The College Director of Physical Education & Sports, Dr. Savio Fernandes provides scientific fitness training and coaching to the students representing the college at various levels of competition. The individuals are not only trained for performance and medals but they are also credited with values and discipline. The College has also developed a Sports Policy and the sports department ensures that the

Sports Policy is being implemented in the college. Other benefits such as Sports Merit Marks, Duty Leave, Practice Allowance, Travelling Allowance and Kit Allowance as per the guidelines of the University are provided to the students. Due recognition is also given to the students who achieve glory in sports by forwarding the reports to the local newspaper

2. National Service Scheme (NSS)

National Service Scheme (NSS) is a voluntary community service scheme for the youth studying in the higher educational institutions. The aim of NSS is to bring out a positive social and political change in the lives of youth by developing

various dimensions of their personality. NSS volunteers are made socially, emotionally, politically and environmentally sensitive towards the process of nation building. The NSS Unit

organizes a 7 day residential 'Annual Special Camp' in a rural area.

All students are encouraged to enrol for NSS. A student joining NSS shall complete 240 hours of NSS regular activity over a period of four semesters completing 60 hours of regular N.S.S activity per semester and one 7 day residential 'NSS Annual Special Camp'.



On successful completion of the above activities, the NSS volunteer shall become eligible to receive a 240 hours completion certificate, issued by Directorate of sports and Youth Affairs, Campal, Panaji, Goa.

3. National Cadet Corps (NCC)

There are 3 divisions/ wings of NCC in M.E.S. College viz, Army Boys Wing, Army Girls Wing and Naval Wing. Army Boys Wing and Naval Wing are available for boys (SD) and girls (SW). NCC is open to all regular students of the college on a voluntary basis. Total training period is three years. The cadets have to appear for 'B' certificate exam after completion of two years and 'C' certificate exams after three years of training. NCC provides a suitable environment to motivate the youth to take up a career in the armed forces. Free SSB guidance is provided to interested cadets. NCC provides uniform, washing allowance, refreshments during the parade, T.A., D.A.

for attending camp, free messing and boarding during camps.

Special weightage and reservation are granted to all NCC 'B' and 'C' certificate passed cadets in armed forces, central paramilitary forces and all the state police forces

FACILITIES

The College offers the following facilities on the campus:

Library: The College has a fully automated library with a collection of approximately 34,103 books and 42 journals and periodicals. The library is equipped with NEW GENLIB software 3.1.4 version. The library is also a member of the N-List program of INFLIBNET. The College has registered for the National Digital Library provided by the MHRD. The library facility is extended to the public. Under the book bank facility, books are given to the meritorious and economically backward students and to students who have enrolled for remedial coaching classes.

Laboratories: The college has well-equipped laboratories, namely, IT Lab, Psychology Lab and Economics Lab.

Sports: The sports facilities include gymnasium, gymkhana/ multi-purpose hall for indoor games, football ground, volleyball court and two basketball courts.



Stationery Shop: The college has a stationery shop which also provides photocopying and printing facilities.

Cafeteria: We now have our very own open-air cafeteria on campus 'MESCAFE' which provides a student friendly ambience.

Canteen: The College has a spacious canteen offering snacks and lunch.



Counselling: The services of two full-time counselors are available for the benefit of students. The counselors are available on all days of the week from 8.00 a.m. to 2.30 p.m.

Health Centre: The College has a Health Centre which is equipped with a bed, first aid box and wheel chair facilities. A private physician visits on a weekly basis.

Wi-Fi: The campus is Wi-Fi enabled and accessible to both staff and students.

Transport arrangement: KTC buses are available at concessional fares.

Book Bank:_Every student will be provided with a copy of text book, required for a particular subject. At

the end of the year, the student has to return the books in good condition. If the books are not returned within the due date and in good condition, the student will be charged an appropriate fine of Rs 10/- per day. The students will have to replace for the books lost or misplaced.

Computer Lab: The students will have access to a well-equipped computer lab, along with internet facility, which will be allowed to use as per the schedule given. However, students are not allowed to use their own CDs in the lab. Any student found doing so will be fined accordingly. Any damage caused to the computer due to such usage will also have to be compensated by the students.


