50 Years of MES

The journey of Murgaon Education Society began on 23rd August 1971, under the Chairmanship of late Shri Vasantrao Joshi and several enlightened persons, in the Joshi building at F. L. Gomes Road, Vasco-da-Gama. It was established to serve the youth of Goa, particularly the youth from the Port Town, with affordable and high-quality education.

The College was shifted to its current campus in Zuarinagar, in June 1985. Since then, the barren Zuarinagar plateau has undergone significant transformation. With the initiation of measures like afforestation, rainwater harvesting, vermicompost and the recent installation of solar panels, the College provides an eco-friendly environment to our faculty, students and visitors.

The infrastructure of the College grew at a steady pace over the years, with the addition of new buildings and departments, to meet the needs of the growing student population and the introduction of new courses and subjects.

In order to provide quality education to the students of the Port Town, a Higher Secondary School with 4 streams: Arts, Commerce, Science, Vocational and an Institute of Management Studies were set up subsequently. The College section initially began with BA and BCOM programs but in order to meet the growing demands of the Computer Applications Course, as well as the Course in Management, the BCA and BBA (General) programs were introduced. An industry specific Diploma course in Shipping Management was instituted which has now been replaced with a Graduate degree (BBA) in Shipping & Logistics. A Postgraduate Degree, MCOM was also introduced in 2016.

Over the last 50 years, the MES College and Higher Secondary Section have grown into well-known educational institutions, being the alma mater for many young men and women from humble economic and social backgrounds. The alumni have indeed risen to great heights and excelled in fields, ranging from education to banking, business to public administration, rendering their service to society and enriching Goa in many ways.

MES College has had a smooth transition from the traditional 'chalk and blackboard' method, to the OHP method and more recently, to Audio-visual teaching and the use of the LCD Projector. The college has further advanced in terms of technological progress, with the launching of Smartboards in some classes. The College has also gone a step ahead in extending the use of the campus to the community at large. It has allowed people in the vicinity to utilize the infrastructure and facilities, such as, the Basketball court, library, etc, while also being a venue for professional examinations.

The flag of MES continues to fly high, with achievements by the Faculty in several areas of research, expertise and Co-curricular activities. Our students have excelled in terms of NSS, NCC Navy and Army, as well as in Sports.

This year, as a part of its Golden Jubilee, the College has planned several programs to celebrate this landmark moment in its history.

The road ahead for the next 50 years proves to be very promising with the help of the Management, Faculty and students.

Vasantrao Subrai Joshi to cater to the need of educational upliftment of youth in Vasco- da- Gama in particular and the state of Goa in general. The College premises was shifted to the present campus in 1985. It was one of the first composite Arts and Commerce colleges in the state of Goa to be affiliated to the University of Mumbai and then to Goa University. The college is currently offering five undergraduate programmes: B.A., B.Com., B.B.A., B.C.A., B.B.A. (Shipping and Logistics) and one postgraduate programme, namely M.Com. To cater to the requirements of the Shipping and Logistics industry, M.E.S. College introduced B.Com. (Shipping Management) which was initially funded by UGC for five years and is currently running as self-financed programme as Bachelor of Business Administration (Shipping & Logistics).






The B.B.A. (Shipping and Logistics) programme is the first undergraduate programme in India which addresses the commercial and managerial side of the shipping industry. The college has a Research Centre in Sociology. At present, the college has approximately 1606 students and 60 full-time teaching faculty.

The college encourages high academic standards. We instil in our students a passion for learning and acquiring knowledge that they will require to make a positive contribution to the society. The college imparts learner-centric education which aims at the holistic development of the students by developing creative and critical thinking, nurturing innovations and excellence, developing professional skills etc.

ADMISSION

I) PROCEDURE:*

(A) For B. A. / B. Com. Semester I & II

The admission process will be managed in online mode through the Integrated Academic Information Management System (IAIMS) Portal of the Directorate of Higher Education DHE, Government of Goa. Candidates aspiring to seek admission should register themselves on the IAIMS portal. Upon registration on the IAIMS portal, the students will be able to generate login credentials required to login to the IAIMS portal for all future correspondence.

- 1. The link for the application form is available on the college website https://www.mescollege.org/
- 2. Gmail ID is mandatory to begin the admission process.
- 3. A passport size photo of the candidate and signature of the candidate (not exceeding 1 MB) should be uploaded.
- 4. The admission form shall be uploaded along with the following documents (each document not exceeding 1 MB):
 - a. Scanned copy of original marksheet of SSC/ Equivalent examination
 - b. Scanned copy of original marksheet of HSSC/ Equivalent examination
 - c. Original HSSC Leaving Certificate/ Transfer Certificate

- d. Eligibility Certificate (in original) issued by Goa University (for those students who have passed standard XII or any other equivalent examination through any other recognized Board other than Goa Board, if applicable)
- e. Scanned copy of original Caste Certificate, if applicable
- f. Scanned copy of original Aadhar card and first page of the bank pass book
- g. Undertaking by the student
- h. Undertaking by the parent
- i. Undertaking for discipline and attendance
- 5. Once the admission form and the relevant documents are uploaded, the student can check the college website for updates on the Merit List.
- 6. The student should pay the admission fees after the Merit List is displayed on the college website.
- 7. The admission is purely provisional, and subject to submission of all valid documents to the college. Failure to submit the necessary documents will lead to cancellation of admissions.
- 8. For applicants who are not shortlisted in the first round of admission:
- a. Applicants may get a chance in the second round of admission, depending on the availability of seats.
- b. The commencement of the second round of admission will be notified on the college website.

(B) For B. A. / B. Com. Semester III, IV, V and VI

- 1. The link for the application form is available on the college website https://www.mescollege.org/
- 2. Gmail ID is mandatory to begin the admission process.
- 3. A passport size photo of the candidate and signature of the candidate (not exceeding 1 MB) should be uploaded.
- 4. The admission form shall be uploaded along with the following documents (each document not exceeding 1 MB):
 - a. Scanned copy of original marksheet of previous semester examination
 - b. Scanned copy of original Aadhar card and first page of the bank pass book
 - c. Scanned copy of original Caste Certificate, if applicable
 - d. Undertaking by the student
 - e. Undertaking by the parent
 - f. Undertaking for discipline and attendance
- 5. Once the admission form and the relevant documents are uploaded, the student can check the college website for updates on the Merit List.
- 6. The student should pay admission fees after the Merit List is displayed on the college website.

Note: No Student shall be given admission after the date specified by Goa University.

II) ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION (OC-66.2)

Eligibility for admission leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Arts/ Bachelor of Arts (Honours)/ Bachelor of Commerce (Honours) shall be as follows.

- **2.1** Eligibility for admission to Semester I & II (in the first year) B.A. /B.A. (Hon.) /B.Com. (Hon.) Programme:
- (A) To be eligible for admission to the Semester I of the Three Years Programme leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Arts / Bachelor of Arts (Hon.) / Commerce (Hon.) the candidate should have passed:
 - (i) The Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) examination conducted by the Goa Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education in any stream, including Vocational stream in the subjects notified by the University from time to time.

- (ii) Standard XII Arts/Science/Commerce or similar examination of another body, equivalent to Goa Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, Goa, and recognized as such by Goa University.
- (B) A candidate not covered under any of the above categories but desirous of seeking admission to the said course may apply to the College. However, the Registrar along with the Dean of concerned Faculty and Chairperson(s) of Board(s) of Studies of concerned subjects shall decide the eligibility.
- (C) A candidate admitted for Semester-I shall be deemed eligible for admission to Semester-II.
- (D) A candidate migrating from another recognized University and desirous of direct admission to Semester-II may be considered for admission provided he/she has cleared/passed First Term/ Semester-I examination of that University with those subjects for which admission is sought and undertakes to successfully complete the other compulsory Courses of Semester-I.

2.2 Eligibility for admission to Semester-III & IV (in the second year) B.A. / B.A. (Hon.) / B.Com. (Hon.) Programme:

- (A) A candidate who has requisite attendance for Semester-I and Semester-II shall be eligible for admission to Semester-III.
- (B) A candidate migrating from any other recognized University may be considered for admission to Semester-III of the B.A. / B.A. (Hon.) / B.Com. (Hon.) provided:
 - (a) He/she has passed the First Year B.A. / B.Com. / B.A. (Hon.) / B.Com. (Hon.) examination in all subjects from that University.
 - (b) He/she had offered at the First Year the same subjects as prescribed under Major category available under the scheme of this University.
 - (c) He/she undertakes to successfully complete the required courses and credits prescribed by this University for Semesters-I & II, if he/she has not already done so in the previous University. Result of Semester IV examination shall be withheld if the candidate fails to fulfil this undertaking.
- (C) A candidate admitted for Semester-III shall be deemed eligible for admission to Semester-IV.
- (D) A candidate from another recognized University may be considered for direct admission to Semester IV provided he/she fulfils the conditions in (a), (b) and (c) at (B) above and, in addition, has passed/cleared Semester-III/First Term examination of the Second Year B.A. / B.Com. of that University. However, the result of Semester IV shall be withheld if the candidate does not fulfil these conditions.

2.3(i) Eligibility for admission to Semester-V (in the third year) B.A./B.A. (Hon.) / B.Com. (Hon.) Programme:

- (A) A candidate who has been declared passed in Semester-I to Semester-IV examinations shall be eligible for admission to Semester-V.
- (B) A candidate admitted for Semester-V shall be deemed eligible for admission to Semester-VI.
- (C) A candidate migrating from any other recognized University may be considered for admission to Semester-V of the B. A. / B.A. (Hon.) / B.Com. (Hon.) Course provided:

- (a) He/she has passed the Second Year B.A. / B.Com. / B.A. (Hon.) / B.Com. (Hon.) Examination in all subjects from that University, and
- (b) He/she had offered at the Second Year the required courses and credits under the scheme of this University. A candidate fulfilling these conditions shall be eligible for admission to Semester-V only.
- (ii) Eligibility for admission to Semester-VI (in the third year) B.A. / B.A. (Hon.)/B.Com. (Hon.)/ Programme:
- (A) A candidate already admitted for Semester-V shall be deemed eligible for admission to Semester-VI. Direct admission to Semester-VI shall not be permitted.

Please note: All provisions of the present Special Ordinance OS-1 (Special ordinance relating to the conduct of Academic Programmes during COVID -19 pandemic) of Goa University shall temporarily supersede the relevant provisions of other Ordinances that govern the Academic Programmes of the University, Academic Terms and Conduct of Examinations. Refund of Caution Money

Application for refund of caution money must be made within six months of the applicant ceasing to be a student of the college i.e. from the last day of the previous academic year, failing which the caution money will be forfeited.

Refund of fees shall be governed by the following circular of Goa University:

The refund of fees will be in accordance with Goa University Circular No. GU/130/Acad-PG/Refund-of-Fees/327 dated 26/11/2019.

(a) If a student chooses to withdraw from the programme of study in which he/she is enrolled, the following five-tier system shall be followed for the refund of fees remitted by him/her.

- (b) Caution Deposit and Security Deposit shall be refunded in full.
- (c) In case of (1) in the table above, 5% of the fees paid by the student, subject to a maximum of Rs. 5,000 shall be deducted as processing charges from the refundable amount.
- (d) Fees shall be refunded to an eligible student within fifteen days from the date of receiving a written application from him/her in this regard.
- (e) The fees of students who have already been admitted to a programme of the University and have paid the fees and are subsequently admitted to another programme shall have to pay the fees for the final admission and claim the refund of fees paid earlier, in which case no administrative charges shall be deducted from fees paid earlier by the student. However, if the fees payable for both the programmes are the same, the fees paid earlier shall be transferred to the final programme where admission is sought.
- (f) All the other cases of refund of the fees will be decided on case to case basis on its merit.

The chosen subject should be one of the subjects opted by him/her at Semesters I, II, III and IV.

A student opting for B.A. (Honours) Semester V and VI will have to complete **six courses** with **24 credits** in each semester.

A student opting for B.A. (Honours) has to complete three Discipline Specific Core (DSC) Courses and three Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Courses in Semester V. A student has to complete three Discipline Specific Core (DSC) Courses, two Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Courses and one Discipline Specific Project (DSP) in Semester VI. Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Courses shall be offered in the main discipline/ subject.

A **compulsory Discipline Specific Project (DSP)** of 4 Credits shall be offered in lieu of any one of the DSE Courses in Semester VI and shall be designed to acquire special/ advanced knowledge. It shall be a specialised course involving application of knowledge in solving / analyzing /exploring a real life situation / difficult problem. Students shall undertake such a

project under the guidance of a teacher/ faculty member. The topic for the Project Work shall be given in Semester V. Students shall be required to carry out work for the Project during Semesters V & VI. The assessment of the Project will be carried at the end of Semester VI. II) B.A. SEMESTER V & VI

(Combination of two subjects)

A student who desires to acquire B.A. degree shall offer **Discipline Specific Core (DSC) Courses** and **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Courses** in **any two subjects** of his/her choice in Semesters V and VI. The chosen subjects should be the same subjects opted by him/her at Semesters I, II, III and IV.

A student opting for B.A. Semester V and VI will have to complete four courses with 16 credits in each semester. A student has to complete one Discipline Specific Core (DSC) Course in each subject and one Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course in each subject in Semester V. A student has to complete one Discipline Specific Core (DSC) Course in each subject, one Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course from one of the chosen subjects and one Discipline Specific Project (DSP) in one of the chosen subjects in Semester VI. Hence, a student has to opt for two courses in each subject of his/her choice in each semester.

The maximum number of seats for each subject for B.A. (General) shall be 30. The seats will be allotted on a First Come First Served basis.

A compulsory Discipline Specific Project (DSP) of 4 Credits shall be offered in lieu of any one of the DSE Courses in Semester VI and shall be designed to acquire special/ advanced knowledge. It shall be a specialised course involving application of knowledge in solving / analyzing /exploring a real life situation / difficult problem. Students shall undertake such a project under the guidance of a teacher/ faculty member. The topic for the Project Work shall be given in Semester V. Students shall be required to carry out work for the Project during Semesters V & VI. The assessment of the Project will be carried at the end of Semester VI.

The maximum number of projects for each department shall be four.

- 13. Accompanying of unauthorized personnel in college campus is prohibited and punishable.
- 14. Students are expected to clear/pay their dues (sports, library, other damages etc.) before collecting their results. On failing to do so, the college reserves the right to withhold the Examination result.
- 15. Students should not involve in unethical practices such as **smoking**, **drinking alcohol**, **consumption of drugs**, **other unethical practices** and shall adhere to dress code.
- 16. Parents/Guardians are advised to contact the College authorities from time to time in order to apprise themselves of the progress of their wards and their attendance.
- 17. Use of unfair means during examination (ISA/SEE) is strictly prohibited. A student, if found guilty, shall be liable for punishment as per the rules prescribed by Goa University.
- 18. Unauthorized use of mobile phones in class is strictly prohibited. Any student violating this rule shall face disciplinary action.

19. Security personnel or any staff appointed by the principal will have full authority to check and verify the identity cards of every student and have right to interrogate any student, in view of security concerns of the college.

Maintenance of college discipline, adherence to its rules and code of conduct and obedience to the instruction issued from time to time by the principal or other college authorities will be mandatory and binding on each student. Appropriate disciplinary action will be taken which includes suspension/expulsion and rustication as per the directives of Goa University and College Discipline Committee.

 Objectives, Roles and Responsibilities of College Internal Complaints Committee
- 1. Prevent discrimination and sexual harassment, by promoting gender amity among students and employees;
- 2. Deal with cases of discrimination and sexual harassment against women, in a time bound manner, aiming at ensuring support services to the victimized and termination of the harassment; The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 came into being after it was passed in the Parliament of India.

It should be noted that according to the Supreme Court guideline Sexual harassment can be defined as "unwelcome" sexually determined behaviour (whether directly or by implication) as:

- 1. Physical contact and advances;
- 2. Demand or request for sexual favours;
- 3. Sexually coloured remarks;
- 4. Showing pornography; and
- 5. Other unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of a sexual nature. (Vishaka judgment by Supreme Court)
 - The following is also sexual harassment and is covered by the Committee:
- Eve-teasing
- Unsavory remarks,
- Jokes causing or likely to cause awkwardness or embarrassment,
- Innuendos and taunts,
- Gender based insults or sexist remarks,
- Unwelcome sexual overtone in any manner such as over telephone (obnoxious telephone calls) and the like,
- Touching or brushing against any part of the body and the like,
- Displaying pornographic or other offensive or derogatory pictures, cartoons, pamphlets or sayings,
- Forcible physical touch or molestation and
- Physical confinement against one's will and any other act likely to violate one's privacy.

The Committee shall meet as often as may be needed and appropriate.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Students are advised to take part in various extra—curricular activities.

1. Department of Physical Education and Sports

The Department of Physical Education and Sports of M.E.S College aims at all round development of each and every student through the participation in various games and sports. The Department organizes various activities and intra-murals such as Inter-class Tournaments, Athletic Meet, which provides an opportunity to the students to showcase their talents. The College also participates in other extra-murals and competitive games held by the Goa University and other associations and Institutions.



The College Director of Physical Education & Sports, Dr. Savio Fernandes provides scientific fitness training and coaching to the students representing the college at various levels of competition. The individuals are not only trained for performance and medals but they are also credited with values and discipline. The College has also developed a Sports Policy and the sports department ensures that the

Sports Policy is being implemented in the college. Other benefits such as Sports Merit Marks, Duty Leave, Practice Allowance, Travelling Allowance and Kit Allowance as per the guidelines of the University are provided to the students. Due recognition is also given to the students who achieve glory in sports by forwarding the reports to the local newspaper

2. National Service Scheme (NSS)

National Service Scheme (NSS) is a voluntary community service scheme for the youth studying in the higher educational institutions. The aim of NSS is to bring out a positive social and political change in the lives of youth by developing various dimensions of their personality. NSS volunteers are made socially, emotionally, politically and environmentally sensitive towards the process of nation building. The NSS Unit organizes a 7 day residential 'Annual Special Camp' in a rural area.

All students are encouraged to enrol for NSS. A student joining NSS shall complete 240 hours of NSS regular activity over a period of four semesters completing 60 hours of regular N.S.S activity per semester and one 7 day residential 'NSS Annual Special Camp'.

3. National Cadet Corps (NCC)

There are 3 divisions/ wings of NCC in M.E.S. College viz, Army Boys Wing, **Army Girls Wing and Naval Wing.** Army Boys Wing and Naval Wing are available for boys (SD) and girls (SW). NCC is open to all regular students of the college on a voluntary basis. Total training period is three years. The cadets have to appear for 'B' certificate exam after completion of two years and 'C' certificate exams after three years of training. NCC provides a suitable environment to motivate the youth to take up a career in the armed forces. Free SSB guidance is provided to interested cadets. provides NCC uniform. washing allowance, refreshments during the parade, T.A., D.A. for attending camp, free messing and boarding during camps.



On successful completion of the above activities, the NSS volunteer shall become eligible to receive a 240 hours completion certificate, issued by Directorate of sports and Youth Affairs, Campal, Panaji, Goa. The NSS Volunteers who complete 60 hours of NSS activity, participation in Annual Special camp, National and international Camps are awarded entitlement marks.

Special weightage and reservation are granted to all NCC 'B' and 'C' certificate passed cadets in armed forces, central paramilitary forces and all the state police forces



4. Activities organized by Various Associations/Cells and Departmental Associations/Clubs

The College Council, various associations and cells such as the Debating Association, Association of Art and Culture, Literary Association, Women's Cell and Departmental Associations organize co-curricular and extra-curricular activities for the benefit of students.

FACILITIES

The College offers the following facilities on the campus:

Library: The College has a fully automated library with a collection of approximately 41,800 books and 54 journals and periodicals. The library is equipped with NEW GENLIB software 3.1.4 version. The library is also a member of the N-List program of INFLIBNET. The College has registered for the National Digital Library provided by the MHRD. The library facility is extended to the public. Under the book bank facility, books are given to the meritorious and economically backward students and to students who have enrolled for remedial coaching classes.

Laboratories: The college has well-equipped laboratories, namely, IT Lab, Psychology Lab and Economics Lab.

Sports: The sports facilities include gymnasium, gymkhana/ multi-purpose hall for indoor games, football ground, volleyball court and two basketball courts.



Stationery Shop: The college has a stationery shop which also provides photocopying and printing facilities.

Cafeteria: We now have our very own open-air cafeteria on campus 'MESCAFE' which provides a student friendly ambience.



Canteen: The College has a spacious canteen offering snacks and lunch.

Counselling: The services of two fulltime counselors are available for the benefit of students in areas of counselling such as career guidance, family issue, peer pressure, addiction etc. The counselors are available on all days of the week from 8.00 a.m. to 2.30 p.m.

Health Centre: The College has a Health Centre which is equipped with a bed, first aid box and wheel chair facilities. A private physician visits on a weekly basis.

Wi-Fi: The campus is Wi-Fi enabled and accessible to both staff and students.

Transport arrangement: KTC buses are available at concessional fares.


