JOINT ACTIVITY FOR NCC AND NSS

A THREE DAYS TRAINING ON DISASTER MANAGEMENT WAS ORGANISED BY GOA INSTITUTE OF PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT – GIPARD IN COLLABORATION WITH MES COLLEGE OF ARTS & COMMERCE FOR NCC CADETS AND NSS VOLUNTEERS OF THE COLLEGE

Report in brief:

A three days training on Disaster Management was organised by Goa Institute of Public Administration and Rural Development – GIPARD in collaboration with MES College of Arts & Commerce GIPARD had also collaborated with Revenue Department (Govt. of Goa) & Water Resource Department (Govt. of Goa). This was a shelter level training under component C of NCRMP-II. The participants were NCC cadets and NSS volunteers of the college. Ms. Arlette Mascarenhas, Core Faculty in Women's Development was the main incharge and coordinator of the 3 days programme 30 students participated in the workshop.

The Government of India has initiated the National Cyclone Risk Mitigation Project (NCRMP) with a view to address cyclone risks in the country. National Disaster Management Authority (NMDA) under the aegis of Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) is the implementation agency of the project in coordination with participating State Governments and the National Institute for Disaster Management (NIDM). The overall objective of the

project is to undertake suitable structural and non- structural measures to mitigate the effects of cyclones in the coastal states and UTs of India covering states of Goa, Gujarat, Karnataka, Kerala, Maharashtra and West Bengal.

The chief guest for the inaugural function was Ms. Arlette Mascarenhas. The first session was Ms. Arlette Mascarenhas who spoke on *Goa State Disaster Profile*. The next session was on *Disaster Management Act 2005, Policy Framework and Institutional Mechanism including Hon'ble Prime Minister 10 Point Agenda* and Evacuation Planning Model for the state of Goa- Authority for Direction and Guidance. The resource person was Ms. Sapna Bandodkar, Dy. Director (Admin) Directorate of Animal Husbandry and *Veterinary* Services Panaji.

After lunch the 3rd session was on *Role & Responsibility of CSMMC Members* by Sr. Remy Lacenda, Ex Faculty Nursing Institute Bambolim and Master Trainer of GIPARD

The 2nd day, started with a review of day 1. Participants were revised about the sessions held on 24th August. This was followed by a session on *Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) Mock Drill* by Shri. Damodar Zambaulikar Station Fire Officer, Department of Fire and Emergency Services Panaji. The next session was on *Basic Fire Safety and Mock Drill* by Shri. Ravi Naik Station Fire Officer and Shri. Truptesh Naik Sub Station Fire Officer Department of Fire and Emergency Services Panaji.

Post lunch was a session by Dr. Jose Noronha faculty SEA SCAN Academy and faculty Kamaxidevi Homeopathic Medical College Shiroda on the topic *Handling Risk of Communicable Diseases and Precautions for COVID 19*. The last session for the day was on *Mental Health and Referral Psycho- Social Counselling During Disaster*. The effects of disaster on women and children and it preventions. The resource person was Shri. Vithoba Mhalkar, Asst. Prof. Dept. of Psychiatric Nursing IPHB Bambolim.

Day 3 started with a review of day 2 sessions. Dr. Pranoy Baidya, Ecologist scientific consultant for CRZ – Goa spoke on *Hazard Risk Vulnerability Capacity* (HRVC) *Analysis Rapid Qualitative Assessment*. The 2nd session was on *First Aid and Bandaging* by Sr. Remy Lacenda, Ex Faculty Nursing Institute Bambolim and Master Trainer of GIPARD. After lunch she spoke on *Different Types of Carriage of Casualties*.

This 3 day training programme ended with an evaluation session and a valedictory function. The chief guest was Dr. Manasvi M. Kamat. The participants were presented certificates, pen drive and a folder. The participants also gave their feedback about the 3 days training workshop and how they benefitted from it.





• **Remarks of the Coordinator:** Students got first-hand knowledge about disaster management, how to handle such crisis situations, practical sessions on first aid, CPR and how to rescue people during disasters.
