


Student Satisfaction Survey 2022-2023

667 responses








The chart above illustrates that of the total of 667 students surveyed, 30.3 percent were of the opinion that 70-84 % of the syllabus was covered, 63 percent were of the opinion that 85-100 % of the syllabus was covered and 6.7 percent were of the opinion that less than 70 % of the syllabus was covered.

4) Student Respondents' opinion with regard to Teachers' communication:




The chart above illustrates that of the total of 667 students surveyed, 49.6 percent were of the opinion that the teachers were always effective in communicating, 33.3 percent were of the opinion that the teachers were sometimes effective in communicating, 13.9 percent were of the opinion that the teachers were satisfactorily able to communicate, and 3.2 percent were of the opinion that communication was not effective.








The chart above illustrates that of the total of 667 students surveyed, 25.5 percent were of the opinion that the teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as excellent, 44.8 percent were of the opinion that the teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as very good, 24.6 percent were of the opinion that the teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as good, and the rest (5.1 percent) were of the opinion that the teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as either fair or poor.




The chart above illustrates that of the total of 667 students surveyed, 11.7 percent strongly agreed that institution provides additional opportunities to grow beyond the syllabus, 39.1 percent agreed that institution provides additional opportunities to grow beyond the syllabus, 32.4 percent neither agreed nor disagreed that institution provides additional opportunities to grow beyond the syllabus, and 6.2 percent disagreed that the institution provides additional opportunities to grow beyond the syllabus and 10.6 percent strongly disagreed that institution provides additional opportunities to grow beyond the syllabus.

9) Teachers inform about expected competencies and outcomes




The chart above illustrates that of the total of 667 students surveyed, 42.7 percent said teachers inform them about expected competencies, course outcomes, and programme outcomes every time; 34.8 percent said teachers usually inform them about expected competencies, course outcomes, and programme outcomes; 16 percent said teachers occasionally inform them about expected competencies, course outcomes, and programme outcomes; and 6.5 percent said teachers rarely or never inform them about expected competencies, course outcomes, and programme outcomes.

10) Teachers illustrate concepts through adequate examples




The chart above illustrates that of the total of 667 students surveyed, 40.2 percent said teachers illustrate concepts through adequate examples every time, 42 percent said teachers usually illustrate the concept through adequate examples, 13.6 percent said teachers occasionally illustrate concepts through adequate examples and 5.2 percent said teachers rarely or never illustrate concepts through adequate examples.

11) Institution/Teachers use student-centric methods




The chart above illustrates that of the total of 667 students surveyed, 28.6 percent said institution/teachers use student-centric methods to a great extent, 44.5 percent said institution/teachers use student-centric methods to a moderate extent, 21.4 percent said institution/teachers use student-centric methods to a certain extent, and 5.5 percent were of the opinion student-centric methods used very little or not at all.




The chart above illustrates that of the total of 667 students surveyed, 31.9 percent strongly agreed that teachers encourage them to participate in extracurricular activities, 45.1 percent agreed that teachers encourage them to participate in extracurricular activities, 18.3 percent neither agreed nor disagreed that teachers encourage them to participate in extracurricular activities and 4.7 percent either disagreed or strongly disagreed.




The chart above illustrates that of the total of 667 students surveyed, 34.8 percent said institution/teachers take efforts to inculcate soft skills, life skills, and employability skills to prepare them for the world of work to a great extent, 43.2 percent said institution/teachers take efforts to inculcate soft skill, life skills, and employability skill to prepare them for the world of work to a moderate extent, 15.3 percent said institution/ take efforts to inculcate soft skill, life skills, and employability skill to prepare them for the world of work to a certain extent, and 6.7 percent were of the opinion institution/teachers take very little to no efforts to inculcate soft skill, life skills, and employability skill to prepare them for the world or work.


The chart above illustrates that of the total of 667 students surveyed, 35.4 percent said institution managed to shift from offline to online during the pandemic to a great extent, 43.5 percent said institution managed to shift from offline to online during the pandemic to a moderate extent, 15 percent said institution managed to shift from offline to online during the

pandemic to a certain extent, and 6.1 percent were of the opinion institution managed to shift from offline to online during the pandemic very little or not at all.



How effectively was information communicated during the pandemic (notices, assignments, results, etc.)



17) Overall quality of the teaching-learning process at the institution: is very good


The overall quality of teaching-learning process in your institution is very good

The chart above illustrates that of the total of 667 students surveyed, 25.9 percent strongly agreed that the teaching-learning process in our institution is very good, 48.4 percent agreed that the teaching-learning process in our institution is very good, 21.7 percent neither agreed nor disagreed that the teaching-learning process in our institution is very good and 4 percent either disagreed or strongly disagreed that the teaching-learning process in our institution is very good.

1. Cafeteria:

The chart above illustrates that of the total of 667 students surveyed, 8.7 percent rated the cafeteria as '5', 12.4 percent rated the cafeteria as '4', 31.63 percent rated the cafeteria as '3', 25.04 percent rated the cafeteria as '2', and 22.19 percent rated the cafeteria as '1'.

2. Library:

The chart above illustrates that of the total of 667 students surveyed, 18.89 percent rated the Library as '5', 23.24 percent rated the Library as '4', 27.44 percent rated the Library as '3', 16.49 percent rated the Library as '2', and 13.94 percent rated the Library as '1'.

3. Wi-Fi:

The chart above illustrates that of the total of 667 students surveyed, 7.95 percent rated the Wifi as '5', 7.20 percent rated the Wifi as '4', 19.79 percent rated the Wifi as '3', 21.89 percent rated the Wifi as '2', and 43.18 percent rated the Wifi as '1'.

4. Counseling:

The chart above illustrates that of the total of 667 students surveyed, 14.09 percent rated the Counseling as '5', 20.69 percent rated the Counseling as '4', 28.34 percent rated the Counseling as '3', 19.49 percent rated the Counseling as '2', and 17.39 percent rated the Counseling as '1'.

5. IT Lab

The chart above illustrates that of the total of 667 students surveyed, 17.84 percent rated the IT Lab as '5', 19.04 percent rated the IT Lab as '4', 25.19 percent rated the IT Lab as '3', 17.54 percent rated the IT Lab as '2', and 20.39 percent rated the IT Lab as '1'.

6. Eco-friendly campus:

The chart above illustrates that of the total of 667 students surveyed, 22.34 percent rated the Eco-friendly campus as '5', 21.74 percent rated the Eco-friendly campus as '4', 25.49 percent rated the Eco-friendly campus as '3', 14.39 percent rated the Eco-friendly campus as '2', and 16.04 percent rated the Eco-friendly campus as '1'.

7. Basic Amenities:

The chart above illustrates that of the total of 667 students surveyed, 9.15 percent rated the Basic amenities as '5', 18.59 percent rated the Basic amenities as '4', 31.78 percent rated the Basic amenities as '3', 22.94 percent rated the Basic amenities as '2', and 17.54 percent rated the Basic amenities as '1'.

8. Sports Infrastructure:
