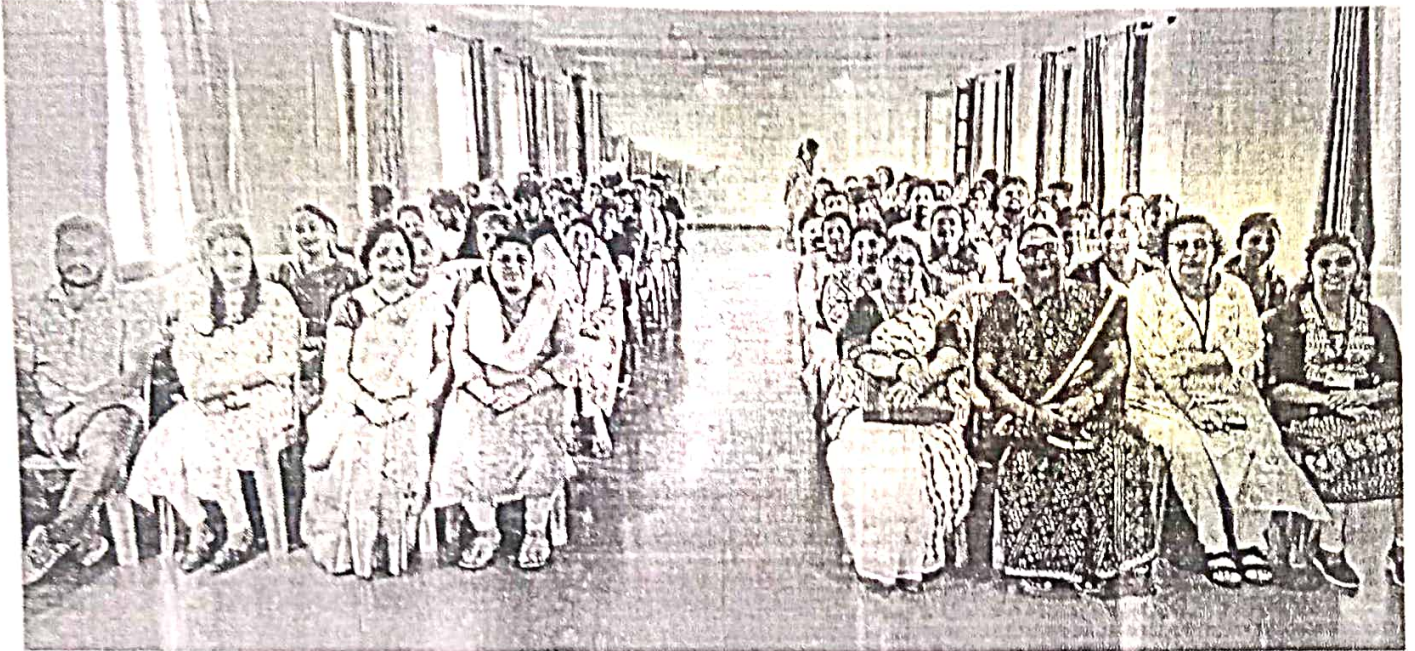
REPORT OF 'WOMEN'S SAFETY AND LAW'

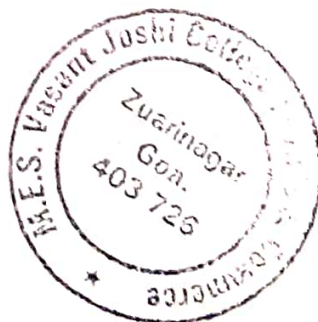
Women's Cell 'Jyoti' in association with Internal Committee organized a session on "Women's Safety and Law" on February 26th, 2024, from 11:00 a.m. to 12:35 p.m. The session on "Women's Safety and Law" aimed at raising awareness and fostering discussion on the legal aspects of ensuring women's safety. The session provided valuable insights into the existing legal frameworks, challenges faced by women in accessing justice, and strategies for promoting women's safety within the campus and beyond.



The session commenced with opening remarks by the Principal Dr. Manasvi M Kamat, highlighting the importance of addressing women's safety concerns and empowering students with knowledge about their legal rights. Dr. Meenakshi Bawa, Presiding Officer of Internal Committee introduced the speaker Ms. Ranjita S Pai, chairperson of Goa State Commission for Women.



The session featured presentation by Ms. Ranjita S Pai, Chairperson of Goa State Commission for Women. Resource person provided an overview of existing laws and regulations pertaining to women's safety, including laws on domestic violence, sexual harassment, and gender-based discrimination. Participants gained insights into the rights afforded to them under these laws and the legal avenues available for seeking redress in cases of violence or harassment. The session was followed by interactive discussions and Q & A sessions with participants.
